# **OVERVIEW**



# **OBJECTIVES**

The Nursing and Midwifery Office outlined the following key objectives for ESP in delivery the 2017 WA Nursing & Midwifery Excellence Awards:

- To publicly recognise and celebrate the achievements of nurses and midwives who have made an outstanding contribution to the nursing and midwifery professions in Western Australia.
- To create a source of inspiration for nurses and midwives, irrespective of where they work, to achieve excellence in providing care to the Western Australian community.
- To create an exciting awards evening to facilitate networking opportunities within the health industry.
- To spark media interest and communicate to the broader public of WA the role of nurses and midwives and the key issues facing the professions today. We aim to give a voice through the Awards program to those that most often go unnoticed.

# SHORT-LISTING & JUDGING PANEL PROCESS

Between August 2016 and December 2016, nominations were submitted for the 2017 WA Nursing and Midwifery Awards. The nomination categories covered all the areas nurses and midwives find themselves working in; whether they are public, private, federally funded or non government services. Given this breadth and diversity, the categories cover the streams they work in including clinical, education, management, and research.

A panel of experienced nurses and midwives from a variety of WA health related services and organisations, as well as high-profile non-health professionals comprise the short-listing and judging panels for these awards.

Confirmations were given to the 31 lucky nominees who proved on paper they had made a significant difference to the health industry in their field. On the 2nd and 3rd of March 2017, these nominees met face-to-face with the judging panel to discuss their experiences and career. The judges deliberated on and made decisions the finest nominee within their category to be named the winner. From this, the panel then determined Amy Wallace from Graylands Hospital the 2017 WA Nurse/Midwife of the Year.

The finalist cocktail party was held on Friday 3rd March 2017 at The Old Brewery. This was an opportunity to announce the finalists, as well as an opportunity for sponsors to meet finalists and the awards organising committee and judging panels. We received great feedback on the event from all who attended.

## **KEY STRATEGIES**

Event Services & Productions implemented the following strategies to ensure a successful event:

### Venue

Bellevue Ballroom at Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre was selected as the location for the event due to its central location, past record with WA Nursing and Midwfiery Excellence Awards, and from the recommendation based on past experience of the appointed event management company, Event Services and Productions.

### **Entertainment**

Returning again in 2017 Master of Ceremonies, Tim Gossage created a highly charged atmosphere with his quick wit and personable approach to the evening. This made everyone feel welcome and very comfortable.

The Welcome to Country was performed by Sandra Harben. This was followed by the Australian national anthem performed by Mia Simonette. These both created a formal and ceremonial beginning to the event.

Party band Proof had guests up and dancing the evening away once all formal proceedings had concluded.

### **Branding**

The branding for the event was decided with the idea of the evening being sophisticated, elegant and a somewhat night of nights for the nursing and midwife industry. The branding was used throughout all event collateral, marketing and multimedia. The branding for the Awards has been consistent over the years to create recognition. This works with the Gala Ball branding however this is bespoke every year to create elegance and excitement.

At the front of the room we had 2x 15m screens butted up to make a 30m wide screen, with a 4M circle screen laid in the middle of these screens which was able to play different content. We went for this option to step the event into the next level with a customised presentation which had a massive impact in the room.

With the extra screen size we were able to maximise the use of sponsor logos and finalist images. Many guests commented positively on this impressive screen option.

# PLATINUM SPONSORSHIP BENEFITS

As our valued platinum sponsor of the event, we endeavour to promote your organisation, and ensure brand exposure was at its optimum level. This was executed in the following ways:

### **Banners**

As a platinum sponsor you were given the opportunity to provide 4 pull-up banners at both the Finalist Cocktail Party and the Gala Dinner. The banners for the Finalist Cocktail Party were close to the stage where the proceedings were carried out. For the Gala Dinner the banners were in the foyer for pre-dinner drinks, to allow maximum exposure.

### **Presenter**

A nominated representative from your organisation was on stage to present the Nurse/Widwife of the Year category on the night, and also had the opportunity for a 3 minute promotional speech. Photos are available.

### Finalist Announcement Cocktail Party & VIP Pre-Dinner Drinks Function

Your company had the opportunity to invite ten of your guests to the Finalist Annoucement Cocktail Party, as well as the VIP Pre-Dinner Drinks Function before the Gala Ball commenced. This VIP function allowed your guests to mingle with other sponsors, the Nursing and Midwfiery Office and VIPs including Premier of Western Australia Hon. Mark McGowan, Director General Dr David Rusell-Weiz and Shadow Minister for Health and Mental Health Hon. Bill Marmion.

Sponsor requirements were all met with the awareness of the brand being highly transmitted. We endeavoured to support and communicate with each sponsor group as much as possible throughout the process. We anticipate the return on this sponsorship package surrounding the highly regarded awards was of value to your organisation.

# IN CONCLUSION

Not only did the event work well aesthetically, but the program and presentations ran smoothly. The atmosphere throughout the whole night was incredible and exciting for the finalists, winners and all guests in attendance.




